## **Dedito Grouse Pointing Weekend**

**August 2nd, 3rd & 4th 2019**



This is a **Weimaraner only** event which will allow beginners together with experienced handlers to experience a rare opportunity for hunting a dog on the prestigious grouse moors of North Yorkshire. Entries will also be made from overseas allowing insight into alternative training and handling methods

**We are very grateful to Dario Martina of Dedito Boots for hosting this event.**

The event consists of the following,

### **Friday 2nd – (optional)**

An informal day to meet & greet & a chance to run your dog on a grouse moor with help and guidance.

### **Saturday 3rd – Training day**

An opportunity to run your dog with help and guidance from knowledgeable trainers (TBC) as well as being able to watch more experienced dogs and handlers at work.

### **Sunday 4th – Grouse Pointing Test**

This will be a grouse pointing test where handlers & dogs will be allowed to hunt & point -grouse under the guidelines laid out for pointing tests and gradings will be given for dogs that fulfill the requirements for pointing tests.

All handlers will have the opportunity to be awarded the Dedito Trophy at the assessment day. This trophy is awarded by the Keepers to the handler and dog who, from a Keeper's perspective, did the best piece of work.



## **Entry Information**

Entries should be made on the accompanying form only.

Entries are accepted on the principal of one dog per handler in the first instance to maximise opportunity for handlers. A draw will take place if more than 10 handlers put an entry in for the Pointing test

## **Entry fees are as follows**

Training days 2nd & 3rd – Members £15/day (£20/day Non-Members)  
Grouse Pointing Test 4th – Members £20 (£25 Non-Members)

Lunch can be supplied for £7.00 per day (This is optional but strongly recommended)

Entrants will be notified as soon as possible after 18th June of the outcome of any draws, when further details will be provided.

## **Please note:**

In deference to our host, entry signifies acceptance of the following

- Sheep may be encountered on the moor and dogs should therefore be 'broken to sheep'.
- No bitches in season should be brought onto the ground
- Second preference dogs/bitches unsuccessful in any second draw may be run, at their handler's discretion, in place of (but NOT in addition to) their first preference dog/bitch
- Dogs not working should be kept on a lead at all times unless the express permission of the host is given.
- Participants should clean up after their dogs in public or sensitive areas.
- The directions of the host, organisers and judges should be strictly adhered to and Judges decisions accepted with the highest standards of sportsmanship
- Dogs not to be left in vehicles unattended on the moor.
